

Dear Friends at Churches on our 2010-11 Deputation Tour,

We, Scotts have been on deputation since the end of October giving testimony to the works of the Lord in Africa. We are very grateful for your support through giving to our deputation expenses, and for your prayers. We want to communicate our sincere thanks. We presented to you projects that God laid on our heart. We also want to give you an update on each of these.

Project 1: CAMPUS IMPROVEMENT These include painting classrooms, widening walkways to make all campus buildings handicapped accessible, etc.

Update: Several have asked how much widening the walkways would cost. The estimate is \$10/ft or \$100 for 10 feet. If anyone wants to help with this, send funds through your local church marked "NTCCA CAMPUS" to Global Treasury, 17001 Prairie Star Parkway, Lenexa, KS 66220.

Project 2: Recruit "SWWAT" TEAMS SMALL WORK & WITNESS AND TEACHING TEAMS (3-8 people) for small building projects (\$2,500-\$3,000) on campus. Airfare varies. Ground money: \$20/day food & fuel + \$75.00 housing + safari. Side trips to Lake Malawi & game park. AND OTHER VOLUNTEERS with skills in hugging (!), game-playing, Physical therapy, Occupational therapy, Special Education to help children with disabilities or volunteers and teaching specialties.

Update: Eugene 1st Church of the Nazarene is going to NTCCA in June 2011 and will be there for graduation. A physical therapist is on the team who will work with the NGO, "Children of Blessing", close to campus. The team will visit the refugee camp, a village church ministry to children, and the pastor will teach in the Integrative Seminar for the graduating students. The team leader, Dave Lyle, is already planning a team for next year!

Project 3: BUILDING THE EDUCATIONAL LADDER (If you send money to Lenexa, please e-mail us.)

- **SCHOLARSHIPS:** Sufficient funds have been sent for all the students set to graduate in June, 2011 with their Diplomas in Theology. Praise God!
